Course Description

Structured around on-site visits, readings, and in-field instruction, this course focuses on the geography of economy and health. Challenges of resource exploitation and environmental pollution, the informal economic sector and economic development policies including structural adjustment are examined through visits to rural and urban markets, a gold mine, a textile factory, cocoa plantation and cocoa research station, chocolate factory, and tourist facilities such as the Slave castles. Visits to indigenous healers, rural clinics, a University Teaching Hospital and a Private Clinic help to unravel the link between economy, culture, sanitation, and health services. In dealing with economy and health care, our goal is to understand WHO gets WHAT, WHERE, and WHY?
